

CALL FOR PAPERS/ CONFERENCE ANNOUNCEMENT

The International Criminal Court Student Network (ICCSN) invites submissions for its
2012 Hague Conference:

The Lubanga Trial: Lessons Learned
March 8-9, 2012 Den Haag, Netherlands

This conference offers undergraduate, graduate and law students, and early professionals/academics (generally within five years of terminal degree) studying or working in the field of International Criminal Law an opportunity to both present and discuss their research. Invited speakers will be asked to prepare comments or a paper. A number of papers will be selected for publication in the ICCSN's journal, *Issues in International Criminal Justice*.

Submissions should be focused on elements of the Lubanga trial OR the International Criminal Court (a small number of general ICC related papers will be accepted) including but not limited to:

- Child soldiers in International Law
- Victim Participation at the ICC
- The Duty to Disclose
- The Philosophical Dimensions of International Criminal Law & Global Justice
- The Role of Civil Society
- The Role of the United Nations
- Interpreting the Rome Statute & The Elements of Crimes

Submissions should include a brief biography (150 words max.) and an abstract (400 words max) to be sent no later than **January 23, 2012** to iccsn@iccsn.com.

Successful applicants will be notified by **February 7, 2012**.

In order to be considered for publication in the ICCSN's journal, *Issues in International Criminal Justice*, successful applicants must submit a conference paper (4000 words max) by **March 1, 2012**.

The deadline for registration is **February 29, 2012**, which can be done online at the conference website (<http://www.iccsn.com/Lubanga>). **Registration costs are \$50.00 US per person.** Unfortunately, the ICCSN cannot cover travel, accommodation and any other expenses. **Registration for participants not presenting a paper is open, and the regular fee applies regardless of whether one is presenting a paper.**
